Classes are limited to 6 students

Registration is confirmed when the class has been paid for in full.

By purchasing your supplies at The Loop, we are able to provide classes at a nominal cost, therefore, all supplies must be purchased in-house.

A 10% discount will be provided for class materials. Excluding looms, wheels, and interchangeable needles.

Students must be able to meet the minimum skills criteria to register for a class or workshop. If it is determined that you require more assistance than is offered in a class, the teacher may move you into a more appropriate class at their discretion.

Beginner students may not register for more than one "major" class at a time.

Our instructors have a set of skills they need to teach you, and a finite amount of time in which to do it, if you are unable to attend the first class of a 101 class, we ask you to please register for a different session as catching up one person will take time away from the other students. Please discuss any other absences with your instructor.

Crochet Skill Levels

Beginner:

Basic chain, single & double crochet stitches. Minimal shaping.

Advanced Beginner:

Skills noted above, plus repetitive stitch patterns, simple colour changes, and simple shaping and finishing.

Intermediate:

Ability to crochet using a variety of techniques, such as basic lace stitches, or colour patterns, mid-level shaping and finishing.

Advanced:

Ability to crochet projects with intricate stitch patterns, techniques and dimension, such as non-repeating patterns, multi-colour techniques, fine threads, small hooks, detailed shaping and refined finishing.

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Knitting Skill Levels
<p>Beginner: Basic knit and purl stitches , cast on, bind off, and minimal shaping.</p>
<p>Advanced Beginner: Basic skills as noted above, plus repetitive stitch patterns, simple colour changes, and simple shaping, and finishing.</p>
<p>Intermediate: Ability to knit a variety of stitches, such as basic cables, and lace, simple intarsia, use double pointed needles, and knitting in the round techniques, mid-level shaping and finishing.</p>
<p>Advanced: Ability to knit projects using advanced techniques and stitches, such as short rows, fair isle, more intricate intarsia, cables, lace patterns, and numerous colour changes. The knitter will be able to 'read' their knitting, use charts, and have the ability to fix errors.</p>
