

# CHUNKY HAT RECIPE



The chunky hat recipe is a simple project that you can complete with 100 grams of Loop House Fine Merino Chunky. Instructions have been included which will enable you to make a basic hat out of any gauge yarn.

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Materials:

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## Materials

- 100 grams of Loop House Fine Merino Chunky
- US10/6.0MM, in the length and type of needle you need to get gauge and to knit in the style that you prefer.
- 1 size smaller needles, in the length and type of needle that you prefer.
- Wool needle

## Gauge:

- 16 stitches = 4" in stockinette stitch on US10/6.0MM needles, unblocked.

## Abbreviations:

K: Knit

P: Purl

K2tog: Knit two together

## PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS:

Using smaller needles, cast on 80 stitches. Join in the round, being careful not to twist.

## Ribbing:

Row 1: K2, P2 around.

Repeat this row until the ribbing is the length that you prefer. I like 1.5 to 2 inches.



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Body of hat:

Switch to the larger needle and knit in the round until the hat measures 5.5" from the cast on edge. (Or knit to the length that you prefer. Knit less for a beanie, knit more for a slouchy hat. Decide what you like by trying on the hat as you near completion)

Decrease section:

Row 1: \*K6, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 2: Knit round.

Row 3: \*K5, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 4: Knit round.

Row 5: \*K4, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 6: Knit round.

Row 7: \*K5, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 8: Knit round.

Row 9: \*K4, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 10: Knit round.

Row 11: \*K3, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 12: Knit round.

Row 13: \*K2, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 14: Knit round.

Row 15: \*K1, K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Row 16: \*K2tog\*, repeat from \* until end of row.

Break yarn, and using wool needle, thread yarn through the remaining 10 stitches and pull to close opening. Weave in ends and block; add pompom if desired. \*If using a thinner yarn, we recommend adding a row or two between your decreases.\*



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To convert this recipe into any other gauge of yarn, do the following:

Knit a stockinette swatch in the needle appropriate for the yarn.

Measure the number of stitches per inch.

Multiply stitches per inch by 20.

Make this number divisible by 8, by adding or subtracting the lowest amount. This will be the number of stitches you will cast on.

The rest of the pattern is knit as written.



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
